Overview: The project includes a theory component and a programming component. Up to three people may work in a group for the project, and only one theory submission and one programming submission are required from each group. It is not necessary to complete the theory component before beginning the programming component, though it is recommended that you do so.

Environment: The project will be in Python and assumes basic programming proficiency. A starter code will be provided. Your code will be tested on the Corn cluster, and as a result you are encouraged to work on a Corn machine. You may access Corn remotely by SSHing into corn.stanford.edu. You may also use the Myth cluster by SSHing into myth.stanford.edu or physically in Gates B02 or B08.

Support: We will provide tutorial materials regarding Python online and will also arrange a help session the week after the project is made available.
